A Note From Pastor Pat



Facebook reminded me this week of something I posted a year ago. Often these anniversary notes elicit joy or meaning as intended, something to which Facebook users will then look forward as part of the Zuckerberg empire. That's exactly what I felt when this particular reminder popped up.

The post was several lines from a book I had just finished, the memoir by Raynor Winn titled <u>The Salt Path</u>. It is her account of the unexpected trek she and her husband took after they literally lost their farm, lock, stock and barrel. Basically penniless, they start walking along the coastal path that follows the southwest coast of England that stretches 630 miles from Minehead in Somerset to Poole Harbour in Dorset.

Because these vagabonds have next to nothing in their possession, their journey is done mostly wilding, a term that describes sleeping out of doors with little or no provision. They do this one day and then another and another never knowing what lies ahead or how they will make it or if they will make it. Uncertainty fills each day. Each day melds into the next.

Yet there is more at work, more than they can understand when they start or in any given period of time along the way. Ms. Winn later looks back and writes, "If we hadn't done this, there'd always have been things we wouldn't have known, a part of ourselves we wouldn't have found, resilience we didn't know we had. . . . Most people go through their whole lives without answering their own questions: What am I, what do I have within me? The big stuff."

Having been reminded of this, thanks to Facebook, I invite us all to take some time to consider these same questions. What is God showing you about yourself? What are some things you have come to discover? Have you seen resilience you didn't know you had? Who are you as a child of God? What has God planted in you that gives you value and purpose?

These are key questions for us individually, and as a congregation, as we come to the last weeks of summer. You'll read more in this Knox News about the ways our leaders want us to zero in on Christ, Connection, Care and Community as the people of God during the rest of 2021 and beyond. Starting August 29th, we will delve into a several month long, deep exploration of these vital elements that hold out the promise of God's rich goodness in life giving ways.

My guess is that no matter how you answer the questions posed above, those answers will spring from, and lead to, the heart of God in meaningful ways to mark a path worth the journey for us all, one step, one day at a time. After all, they reflect the timeless mission of God who loves us all and wants us to experience life to the fullest. Who knows what we will come to know and what we will find as we walk by faith right now and in the days to come!

4C's Transformation Paths

As we prepare for and anticipate the arrival of a new pastor, **now** is the time to take stock of how the spirit is shaping

Knox for ministry through the coming years. In an effort for our congregation to more fully live out the Christian life as described in the book of Acts, a small group of Knox leaders has developed a model to move us further along the paths that lead to living in the "Way" of Jesus.

The 4C's Transformation Team identified four "paths" that are essential to the life of our church and its ministry.



4C Paths:

Christ: Each person develops a meaningful relationship with God.

Connection: Every Person has a meaningful relational connection within the Knox family.

Care: Every person knows that Knox cares about him or her personally.

Community: Respond to the greatest needs of the Naperville area and to the communities beyond Naperville.

Each area of ministry, the councils, staff, and deacons, have all been asked to consider how what we do in ministry aligns with these paths. Each group is considering how it is possible to move further along the paths through creativity and dreaming new ideas for Knox. Because we care deeply for Knox, this is an excellent time to consider what we *do* not only as ministry teams but also as individuals. How do we as individuals help others to be connected to Knox? How do we help to care for one another? What are we doing to consider and respond to the needs in our community? Finally, what are we doing to make our lives Christ Centered?


Knox is getting a software upgrade!

We are excited to announce that the system we have used for 15+ years is finally going to be upgraded to Realm. This is short for Real Life Ministry, which is what Knox is all about. Realm is going to help us connect with each other in new ways.

Our upgrade was postponed due to Covid but now is scheduled for the end of August. This

new program will give everyone easier tools, applications and registrations that benefit our Knox community. We will be able to connect with each other in new ways by creating our own groups, say for Bible studies or volunteering. You will have access to your online giving and can also change all of your personal information much easier than we could before. You can even upload a selfie!

All of the information will transfer over from our current system so there is nothing that you need to do now. Once we do convert over you will need to create a new password for your Knox Connections account but everything else is done behind the scenes. Details will be available in the coming weeks – so watch for our updates regarding – Realm.


