According to the Farmers' Almanac ("since 1818"), the month of January draws its name from one of the mythical gods of the Roman pantheon. This god, Janus, literally meaning "archway," was the Roman god of doors and gates. By virtue of this, he is seen as the god of beginnings and endings. So, as the almanac folks write, his name is "appropriate for the beginning of the year."

This begs the question, "Why wasn't the month at the end of the year named for him?" It could have been, as in the god of endings, right? It turns out December is so named for being the tenth month ("deca" for ten). We will immediately remember that it is not the tenth month at all. It was, however in the ancient Roman calendar year. Our twelfth month is named the tenth month! This just goes to show us that life can get pretty confusing.

What a confusing, confounding and convoluted year 2020 has been! It's challenges have touched all people in all nations. It's touched each person, us included. From the broadest impact to the most particularized, it is not a year we will soon forget. It is, actually, not a year we should forget. In fact, it's a year for us to seize for all it is worth related to what we may have learned or yet need to learn.

As we move from the end of 2020 to the beginning of 2021, it is a perfect time to consider three all-encompassing themes, looking back and looking forward. These themes can be expressed as what we have learned, or what we might expect to yet learn, about God, about ourselves and about what God wants us to do as God's people, as disciples of Jesus.

This is also true for us as a congregation. Our world has shifted. What shifts will be required for us to stay in step with God's best? As 2021 begins, let us pray that the Spirit of God will show us the path we are to follow, give us the wisdom to know how live in that way and the conviction and courage to forge ahead for the sake of our entire ministry and mission.

The god Janus is depicted with two faces, one looking back, one looking forward. May we take time to do both, and may God lead the way into what promises to be one of the most important years ever in the life of Knox, all to God's glory.

If you are not comfortable with these in person options, after January 3, we will offer an online form and Knox will mail you your star!




Thank You Curt & Jan!



Stamps and Tops - No Soup!

Knox no longer accepts Cambell soup labels for the "Box Tops for Education" program. This campaign was phased out several years ago. Presbyterian Women (PW) is happy to accept used postage stamps that are carefully trimmed with scissors. (Leave about 1/4 inch border.)

These stamps are sent to the Alliance Stamp Ministry in Shell Point, FL, where they are categorized and sold to stamp collectors around the world.

Funds support missions and a special project in Latin America called the "Sunday School Curriculum Project," where Sunday school materials for children are printed in Spanish. Additionally, PW also accepts pop tops from soda cans that are given to the Ronald McDonald House charities. Stamp and top donations may be placed in the willow basket on the Mission table outside Lehman Hall.

What a blessing to see the arms of our church family reach so far & wide!!




Sisseton Hygiene Bags Thank You-
