“Neighborly” A Family Devotional

Can you think of any "great" things you can do for others?

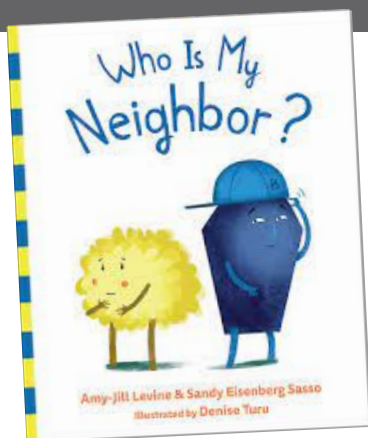
How else can you love your neighbor this week?
