"Restore" Summer '21 Sermon Series Knox Presbyterian Church

"Restore"

Times can be tough. Things we think will be one way end up going a completely different way. Where we expect good, bad shows up. We think the way will be smooth, and things get really rough. Life throws curve balls when we expect something right up the middle that we can hit out of the park. Things can, and do, go haywire and leave us in places of need.

Catholic contemplative Fr. Richard Rohr offers that life is all about this constant trinity: order, disorder and reorder. All of us know our seemingly ordered lives were turned inside out and upside down by the COVID 19 realities of the past 12-15 months. If there was ever a clear sign that disorder can come, this is it. In any season of disorder, reorder is always on the way for those who can see it, welcome it and invest in it with God's help.

The people of God found themselves in a place like this in the Fifth Century B.C.E.

Knox Protocol Update

- For fully vaccinated persons masks are optional but encouraged in all settings.
- For unvaccinated persons masks are required in all indoor settings.
- Masks are required when working with children and youth regardless of vaccination status.
- Social distancing of 3 feet is encouraged.
- Registration remains in place for all events.
- Capacity of 60% in all walled areas.

They found themselves in circumstances that felt about as far from normal as possible. Their lives had been ripped and torn and dislocated. God had not forgotten them. God had a plan, one that would allow for the reordering they needed, one that would restore what had been lost.

This summer we'll look at what happened when they began to understand that change was underway, when circumstances, openness to God and their own determined steps brought them into position to a deeper and richer life as God fully intended. This is the story of Nehemiah and the people of God. It can be our story, too. As we enter into their story, may we experience God's gracious power to restore and bless beyond measure.




TREATS




Knox Connects

Garden Walk 2021


Presbyterian Women of Knox will host a Garden Walk from 9.30 am – 3.30 pm on Saturday, July 10.
