We have been traveling through a transition time literally like never before in Knox's history. A page has now been turned that propels us forward in a fresh way. The PNC will meet as soon as possible to learn all about their responsibilities. The members of the committee will then begin to write the documents that, once approved, open the door to receive resumes perhaps in a few months.

The great work of discernment then begins in earnest for an unknown period of time until they are ready to present a candidate to the congregation. Please pray for them, and pray for all God has in store right now for Knox. This isn't a time to sit back and wait, but a time to keep pressing forward. God is on the move! # Tornado Relief



As all of us have now lived through a tornado threat, we have learned 130 Knox families have actually been in the area of the tornado's path. We would like to share the three initiatives Knox has undertaken to provide support.

**First**, thankfully, our wonderful Deacons have been able to contact each of the 130 families and have determined they are doing well, despite some tree damage.

**Second**, we know there are other less fortunate families who have been displaced from their homes or who are living in homes in need of extensive repairs. We are happy to share that that Knox presented a \$1,000.00 check from the Knox Pastors Discretionary Fund to Little Pops Pizza on Wherli Road. A number of us received an email from Little Pops announcing they are 100% matching donations and will hand out gift cards to the families affected for free Little Pops meals. Mission Elder Kim Williams and her family know the Nelson family, who own Little Pops, and can vouch for their integrity and their fantastic food! We love knowing Little Pops is actually in the affected area and can provide immediate relief with comfort food.

**Third,** Knox, the City of Naperville, and the Chicago Presbytery, are recommending that anyone wishing to donate monetarily, do so through the Illinois Region Red Cross. You can find their website at <u>www.redcross.org/local/illinois</u>.

# Lifespring Urgent Need For Childcare @ Lifespring Ministries

Lifespring has recently been blessed with 6 kids who, along with their mothers, reside at the facility. There is an urgent need for childcare workers to work on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 10-noon. High school-aged kids with experience are welcome to volunteer, as are adults. There is also an opportunity to serve from 6-7 pm in the evenings.

Lifespring, a division of Wayside Cross, is a Christ-centered recovery and long-term transitional living program which offers safe shelter for women and children who have lost their housing due to addiction, abuse or financial crisis, with the support and reaffirming care they need. Housed inside a refurbished convent, this ministry provides a safe and loving environment where women learn the necessary skills to make new choices, live independently and build strong support systems while they encounter Jesus Christ. The ladies are encouraged to face their problems, plan their future, and work towards self-sufficiency. More over, children find a safe place to play and grow while moms get the help they need.

At Lifespring, leaders minister to the whole person through Bible studies, biblical guidance classes in parenting, finances, cooking and nutrition, GED tutoring, computer skills and more.

In addition, they connect residents with individual mentors and local churches to build new support systems and healthy friendships.

#### **Hesed House**



Knox supports the guests at the Hesed House homeless shelter in Aurora on the 4th Saturday of the month. We provide a hot dinner, a hot breakfast, lunch bags and other supplies. In 2021, we will be serving all 12 months.

Sign up online or in person to attend. Cost is \$15. When you sign up, you can download a garden brochure and optional maps.


