Greetings from Pastor Dave Handley

How Giving Thanks Purifies Our Hearts



Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

(Philippians 4:6-7)

The Apostle Paul had reason to be anxious. As he wrote these lines to his beloved disciples in Philippi from chains in a Roman prison, at any moment he might hear the rattle of keys in the

latch as the jailer came to take him to the executioner's chopping block. As he counseled the Philippians how to deal with their considerable anxieties, he knew of what he spoke.

The satirist Samuel Johnson penned the famous lines, "When a man knows he will be hanged in a fortnight, it concentrates his mind wonderfully." As the apostle moves toward the end of his life, his heart is purified wonderfully...by Thanksgiving. In that cold Roman prison, Paul could have been brooding over the tyranny and injustice of Roman law, embittered by the rejection of his fellow Jews, outraged over the pagans who had reported his "turning the world upside down" by proclaiming "foreign deities" (Jesus) as the Savior of all. He could have begun his letter by shaking an angry finger at the Philippians, frustrated over the petty contentions between two of their leaders, Euodia and Syntyche. Instead, he leads with...Thanksqiving. I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy for all of you (Philippians 1:3). Yes, a heart purified by Thanksgiving, and this spirit pulses through his letter.

In twenty years at Knox, there has not been such a crucial time to lift up the banner of Thanksgiving. It is a time of loss, as two beloved Pastors have felt God's call to renew the First Presbyterian Church of Lake Forest. It is a time to give thanks for Clinton and Deb for all these years of faithful and inspirational service. It is a time to trust that this historic change has not taken God by surprise; but that, in fact, God has plans to do a new thing (Isaiah 43:18).

You can play a significant role in embracing this spirit of Thanksgiving at Knox by investing in its future, more than ever. Stewardship Sunday is November 17. Our theme expresses this trust and call to action: Because God Loves Us, We Are the Church. By this action step of financial investment in Knox's future, may we feel the heart of this great congregation PURIFIED!

Already it is time to start planning our Christmas Card Project. The Christmas cards we send mean so much to those who receive them. Incarcerated people are isolated. A simple card lets them know they

are not forgotten. Every year many write to say how much it means to know that someone cared enough to write and often tell us that our card was the only Christmas card he/she received.

Will you help us with this project again this year? We would be so grateful. It is as simple as signing cards and adding a message if you wish. Messages should be uplifting, expressing compassion. Please do not be preachy. Our witness is in our caring concern.

As always, we have a big need for postage stamps.

Very important:

- Do not use stickers, glue, paste or tape on the cards or envelopes. This restriction includes purchased cards. Prison regulations will not allow us to use such items.
- Last year we received a few cards back that had glitter on them so please don't sign any cards that have glitter on them.

- Do not enclose anything.
- Do not seal the envelopes.
- Please send us the stamps in a separate envelope. Do not attach to the envelopes.
- Do not use cards that talk about novenas or masses. Most of those on our mailing lists will not understand what that means.
- Please use cards which represent a diverse population.
- It would be helpful if you would rubber band the cards signed by children and keep them separate.

Please place your donated Christmas cards and stamps in the collection box marked "Companions Journeying Together Christmas Card Project "on the mission file cabinets in the Coffee Bar area by November 3rd.

HEARTS OF HOPE for single moms





the day after that. Now that boy who was alone is now one of their friends and they sit together every day for lunch.

Then after he shared his story, another girl raised her hand and shared with the group that there is a teacher at her school that is very grumpy and can be mean. She said that the teacher is known for being mean and the kids are often mean to her. The girl who is in 6th grade decided she was going to say hi to this teacher each and every day and she has. Each and every day she greets her with a hello and a smile so that the teacher gets to experience some kindness during the day.

Finally, one girl shared that she is helping a student in her class with special needs. She noticed that she became frustrated when she did not understand something so she asked the teacher if she could sit with her to help her each day, and that is what she has been doing.

The middle school youth are hoping that their kindness will be contagious.




