## **Important Alert**

The Federal Trade Commission has issued a warning for all churches regarding gift card scams. Now, scammers are pretending to be pastors, rabbis, priests and even members of their own congregation asking worshipers for gift card contributions for a worthy cause. They are making their requests by email, texts

and some even phone calls. For example, the email address isn't the one normally used by the church, and maybe the name or extension on the email is a little different. There also may be spelling errors, including the pastor's name.

Knox staff will not send you an email asking you to purchase a gift card for another member. Please do not purchase a gift card for someone at Knox when asked via email or text. If you are unsure about a request call the Knox office at 630-355-8181. If a Knox member has a financial need the pastors have several ways to assist them and do so throughout the year through your generosity.

The Chicago Tribune named Glessner House one of the top twenty architectural gems in Chicago. Built in the 1880's, the 17,000

square foot residence was a radical departure from the fussy Victorian taste of the time. It is located on Prairie Avenue, once home to Marshall Field, George Pullman, and other business and social leaders of the 19th century.
